1. ORGANIZATION

World Ice Snow Sailing Association (WISSA)
Winnebago Association of Kiteboarders (WAK)
Wind Power Surf Shop

2. PURPOSE OF THE EVENT

The purpose of the World Ice & Snow Sailing Championship is to define the World Champion in each of the defined race classes, in each of the defined competitions. Serving the objective to promote ice and snow sailing worldwide.

3. VENUES

The event will be held on the southeast corner of Lake Winnebago, 1km off Roosevelt County Park, Fond du Lac, Wisconsin. The Race Office will be at the Wind Power Windsurfing & Kiting Center, N7357 Winnebago Drive, Fond du Lac, WI 54937 USA.

4. RACE CLASSES

The classes are:

Sleds with handheld sails, that means standard windsurfing rigs, in three disciplines (Course Race, Short Track Slalom, and GPS Speed).

Kites, Foil with skis and Kites, Foil with snowboards. Kites, Inflatable with skis and Kites, Inflatable with snowboards. All Kites in three disciplines (Course Race, Freestyle and GPS Speed).

Wings Kitewings and Skate sails three disciplines (Course Race, Short Track Slalom and GPS Speed).

8. AGE DIVISIONS

Overall	All competitors
Women	All female competitors
Junior	under 20 years on February 5, 2019
Master	35 years on February 5, 2019
Grand Master	45 years on February 5, 2019
Veteran	55 years on February 5, 2019

A minimum of five (5) entries is required to constitute a (division) within a class

9. COMPETITIONS

Course Race Up to 10 races on a triangular course (same for all race classes). A minimum of five (5) races are required.

Speed Trials Up to 3 runs. Speed will be measured with a radar gun and/or a GPS unit. There will be no class segregation in the speed trials.

Long Distance Race Course and conditions to be determined at Skippers meeting.

Short Track Slalom Wings and Sleds. Races on a figure 8 and/or slalom course. A minimum of five (5) races are required.

10. AWARDS

A class will qualify for awards if there are at least five (5) competitors registered.

A division will qualify for awards if there is at least five (5) competitors registered that meet the age criteria. If a division does not qualify then each participant in the division will be assigned to the nearest group by the age or to the nearest group of the participant's choice.

The winner of each competition in every class is awarded the title of the World Champion in the competition of the class.

The winner of each competition in every class in every qualified division is awarded with the title of The "Champion of the Division in the competition of the class."

11. PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded to the best three competitors in the course race in each class and division for men, women, and youth.

Prizes will be awarded to the best three competitors in the long distance race in each class and division for men, women, and youth.

Prizes will be awarded to the best three competitions in the speed trials in each division for men and women regardless of the race class.

Prizes will be awarded to the best three competitors in the Short Track Slalom STS in each class and division for men, women, and youth.

12. ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Competitors must be officially registered and must have signed a "release and hold harmless" certificate. Competitors must be willing to race at their own risk.

No organization or individual will be held responsible for any moral or material damage that may be sustained during travel or arrival at the championship venue.

It is the responsibility of each competitor to participate in the safest possible manner at all times. Helmets must be worn during competition and protective clothing is highly recommended. Life and liability insurance coverage for the period of the event is also strongly advised.

13. RULES

The competition will be governed by:

- Racing Rules of the ISAF, suitable for ice and snow sailing.
- WISSA Rules
- WWR4 (Winter Windsurfing Rules 4th Edition).
- Notice of Race (except for alterations stated in the sailing instructions).
- Sailing Instructions.

WISSA Rules and Sailing Instructions will be available at the time of the final registration and check-in. The sailing instructions may be modified at Skipper meetings.

15. SITE INFORMATION

The races will be held on the south end of Lake Winnebago. Approximately 0.6mi (1 km) offshore from Roosevelt County Park, Fond du Lac, WI (Wind Power Surf Shop location) This Area is known for good winds. Ice conditions in February are usually the best conditions of the entire season.

Average temperature: 20 degrees F (-6 C)
Average wind: 15-20 mph (24 – 32 km/hr)
Surface: Ice and Snow
Ground quality: Hard
Ice Thickness: 16”- 24” (40-60 cm)

17. REGISTRATION FOR RACING

Registration will take place from 12:00 to 14:00 on Monday, February 4, 2019 at Race Headquarters (Wind Power Surf Shop). Each competitor shall personally register and sign the registration form and pay the entry fee prior to his/her first race in the event (a parent or guardian under age of 18 shall register and sign on behalf of the competitor him/herself).

Competitors will be required to sign the waiver release and hold harmless form.

Original Entry Form (Form 1)

Parental/Legal Guardian Assent (Form 2) – for those under age of 18

Medical Treatment Permission – for those under age of 18 or on their parents’ insurance policy

18. ENTRIES & PAYMENT

The registration fee before Jan 1st is \$200 USD which includes a \$10 donation to WISSA. After Jan 1st the registration fee is \$250 USD. Onsite registration will be \$300 USD.

Registration for Juniors (under 20 years on February 5, 2019) before Jan 1st is \$100 USD which includes a \$10 donation to WISSA. After Jan 1st the registration fee is \$150 USD. Onsite registration will be \$200 USD.

The decision of the organizer will be final. Sponsor's sail stickers are obligatory.
